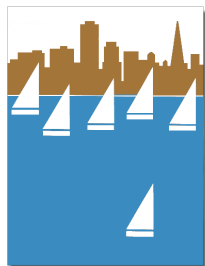

Parking Permit ... The original deadline for submitting parking pass applications was December 15, 2009. We extended that date to January 15, 2010 which has now passed. We will not be giving any more extensions. All those wishing to submit a parking pass application will now be charged \$50.

Please remember you must have current boat registration documents and insurance before you can receive your parking passes. All boat owners must be listed.

Passes are not being mailed. So please stop by the office to pick them up. We suggest you call the office first to make sure they are ready.

2010 Parking Passes must be displayed in your vehicle starting February 1, 2010. Those without a current pass will be subject to a \$50 ticket. If you have any questions on either of these two issues please do not hesitate to contact the Harbor Office.

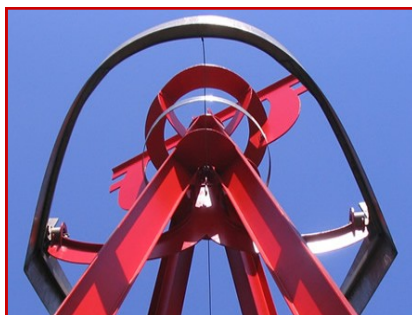

Clean Boating Map

San Francisco Bay Area Clean Boating Map... In order to help boaters and the general public conveniently access information about pollution prevention services in San Francisco Bay, the City and County of San Francisco Department of the Environment, DBAW and the California Coastal Commission produced the San Francisco Bay Area Clean Boating Map.

The free map features locations of marina-based pollution prevention services such as sewage and bilge pumpouts, port-a-potty- dumping stations, used oil collection services and boat-to-boat services. It covers the nine Bay Area counties. The free Map is now available just inside the Harbor Office entrance door.

Harbor staff is working on ways to contact you in case of emergency or to inform you of events or activities that are important but not an emergency. Regarding the latter, we are researching phone and email services that may be used separately or in conjunction with one another when we need to contact you with an important, non-emergency messages. Examples

might include temporary loss of electrical power to your dock, gangways closed due to refurbishing, relocating your vessel during maintenance, emailing the Newsletter rather than mailing it, etc.
